Christmas Tree Safety

As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire smart! Check out these tips for ensuring safety this holiday season:

Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.

Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk.

Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.

Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.

Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.

Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.

Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.

Get rid of the tree after Christmas or when it is dry. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage, or placed outside against the home.

Winter is Officially Here!

If you are still interested in having plastic put on your windows for the winter, please submit a maintenance request/service issue on your Tenant Web Portal. The heat is on!

- Some tips for staying warm in your apartment as the weather gets colder:
- Make sure all windows are fully closed.
 - Have plastic put on your windows and patio door to minimize drafts in your home.
 - Move furniture away from baseboards to allow air to circulate.
 - On very cold days make sure to keep your blinds down & in a closed position.
 - Opening your patio door brings in excessive cold air into the apartment.



As snow comes into our forecast, American Rentals LLC maintains the sidewalks and parking lot for snow removal. We will send reminders out when the plow trucks will be on property.

It is your responsibility to remove any snow on the sides of your vehicle, if you do not move your vehicle when the plow truck is on property.

If you have an exterior air conditioning cover, please put it on your unit. Please do NOT run your air conditioning if you have an exterior cover on your air conditioner.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS



As a reminder, please help maintain security of all residents by not propping the entrance doors to the building. If you see the door propped open, please close it and notify management on your Tenant Web Access portal. **Propping of locked lobby doors is a security issue and a lease violation, this includes propping the door open for children coming home after school and for package deliveries.**

All money owed to American Rentals LLC is part of rent by law, including but **not limited to late fees**. Late fees are \$10 per day after the 1st of the month. Late fees are accrued until the **rent is paid in full**. Due to bank policy, **starter checks and third party checks are NOT accepted by American Rentals LLC.**

Please use your online tenant web access portal to submit maintenance/service requests.

Reminder: Per the Rental Agreement for each tenant, American Rentals LLC requires a 60-day written notice given from the 1st of the month for move-out. There is a no winter move-out clause in effect from November 1st to February 28th.



DUMPSTER REMINDERS

Reminder that garbage needs to be placed **INSIDE** the dumpsters. Also, please remember to break down your boxes before placing them into the recycling. The dumpster enclosure is monitored and violations are documented.

PARKING LOT REMINDERS

All vehicles must be parked in the assigned parking spot in the lot. Please park within the yellow lines. Violations of the parking rules gives management the right to revoke your parking privileges. Any non-working vehicles will be towed unless approved by management.

All guests must park in the designated visitor parking; no exceptions. This includes dropping off and picking up. Visitor parking is located between the B and C buildings.

COMMON AND PATIO AREAS

- Halls are to be kept clear of your personal belongings, including shoes!
- Patios are for storage of outside items such as furniture, grills, bikes, patio boxes, and plants. All other items will be removed by management. Any items left in the lawn or hedges is considered abandoned. Clothes are not permitted to be hung outside using the balcony, hedges, or posts.
- All items must be placed in each tenants' basement bins. Any items left outside of the bins will be considered abandoned.
- **Sidewalk chalk is NOT allowed.** The use of sidewalk chalk is a violation of the lease.
- Please make sure you are removing your laundry from the laundry rooms in a timely manner.

Recipe: Peppermint Meltaways

- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1/2 cup confectioners' sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon peppermint extract
- 1-1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup cornstarch

FROSTING:

- 2 tablespoons butter, softened
- 2 tablespoons 2% milk
- 1/4 teaspoon peppermint extract
- 2 to 3 drops red food coloring, optional
- 1-1/2 cups confectioners' sugar
- 1/2 cup crushed peppermint candies

Directions: In a small bowl, cream butter and confectioners' sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in extract. In another bowl, whisk flour and cornstarch; gradually beat into creamed mixture. Refrigerate, covered, 30 minutes or until firm enough to handle. Preheat oven to 350°. Shape dough into 1-in. balls; place 2 in. apart on ungreased baking sheets. Bake 9-11 minutes or until bottoms are light brown. Remove from pans to wire racks to cool completely.
